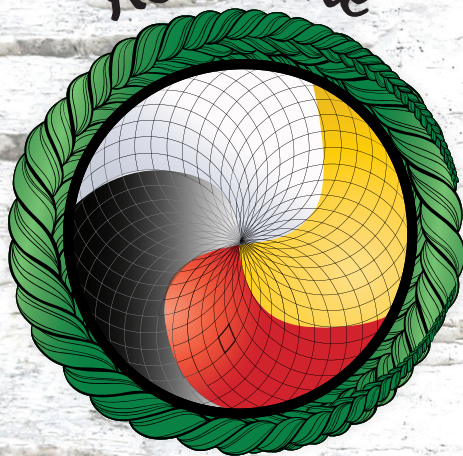

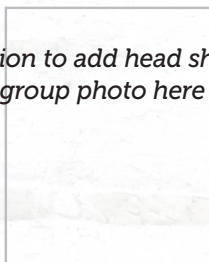

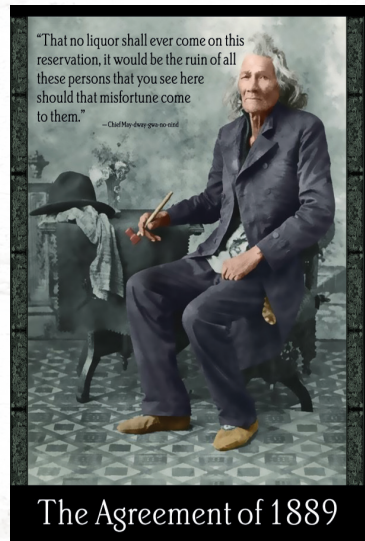

RED LAKE ADOLESCENT GROUP HOME



Referrals to the Red Lake Group Home are most often initiated by the Court System and/or Social Services in an effort to provide unsettled youth and opportunity for change.

Most referrals are youth who are having a difficulty at home, school or within the community.

The Group Home gives these young people an opportunity to explore their current behavior/attitudes and a chance to discover a healthier and more positive lifestyle. It is our goal to provide quality care to each resident during their program at the Group home and to promote a positive transition back into their homes and community.

Our target population is American Indian Youth, however, we will accept non-Indian adolescents, who need placement in a structured program.

Began operations in 1987.

The Mission of the Red Lake Nation Oosh-Kii-Mii-Kah-Nah (Halfway House) and Gii-waa-din (Northern Winds) is to provide the best quality Chemical Dependency Primary Treatment services to all Red Lake Nation Tribal enrolled members and all Federally Recognized Tribal Members, residing on/off the Red Lake Nation Reservation. This is achieved by treating every client individually and blending our Native American Traditions and Beliefs with the 12-Step Alcoholics Anonymous program, in accordance with Minnesota State Statute.

Gii-waa-din (Northern Winds) does not discriminate against people regardless of their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, age or disabilities.

Gii-waa-din (Northern Winds) is under the direction of the Red Lake Chemical Health Programs and is governed by the Red Lake Band of Tribal Council.

Gii-waa-din (Northern Winds) is a 15-bed co-ed facility: 10 male, 5 female.

16 years of age

Medically Stable

PERSONS NOT ELIGIBLE:

Convicted Sex Offenders
Persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs, unless prescribed
Those who may pose substantial threat of physical harm to themselves or others.

MEDICATION ASSISTED RECOVERY SERVICE (M.A.R.S)



Began operations Nov. 13, 2017.

An Outpatient clinic specializing in the person-centered treatment of Opioid Dependency using medically administered Buprenorphine

INDUCTION REQUIREMENTS

Intake (pre-screening tool)

Complete a Rule 25 with appropriate recommendations for MAT/Outpatient Services

Must have Active M.A (Medical Assistance); documentation of application completed or denial letter.

Priority will be given to: Elders, Pregnant Women, IV users

Pregnant Women past 3rd Trimester must enter and complete Inpatient Treatment

Pregnant Women will be administered Subutex

UPON INDUCTION TO R.L.M.A.R.S, CLIENTS ARE REQUIRED TO:

Dose Daily (Suboxone/Subutex)

Required to attend Prenatal Appointments

Be prepared to provide a UA daily

Refrain from any and all Illicit Drug Use

Develop Treatment Plan with Counselor

Attend Groups (Based on Treatment Plan)

Meet 1:1 with Counselor (Based on Treatment Plan)

Adhere to Policies and Procedures of R.L.M.A.R.S

SERVICES INCLUDE:

Treatment with approved medications

Medically Supervised withdrawal from opioids utilizing
Suboxone (buprenorphine/nalaxone), Subutex (buprenorphine)

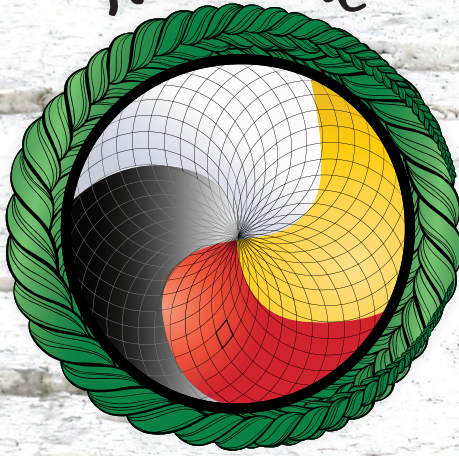
